For this painting unlike the painting of the Alder/Small Tortoiseshell a wash of *Burnt Sienna* was added, giving a much more warmer tone to the background, with a wash of *Cobalt Blue* 

to the leaves adding to the contrast.

Notes: Red Admiral Vanessa atalanta

Whereas the caterpillar feeds on stinging nettles and thistle the adult feeds by sucking sap from trees and juices from fruit. The adult migrates from southern Europe by July/August but can be seen as early as May. The butterfly will hibernate through winter, although not many survive.\*

Beech Fagus sylvatica

Grows to around 20 -30 metres with a rounded crown; some branches grow almost horizontal. The bark is smooth and grey coloured. The leave are ovoid in shape with a glossy dark green colour turning red in Autumn. The fruit is in a three cornered woody spiked casing.\*
